Jersey Promise – Board Member and Co-author of the first-ever report on the state of Asian Pacific Americans in New Jersey. 2019. As the name Jersey Promise suggests, our goal is for the State and its APA communities to reach our full potential as a diverse state and to bring the wonderful mosaic of our communities together. Advocating for Asian Americans and New Jersey starts by telling the story of who we are as Asian Americans: a widely diverse, heterogeneous community. In sharing our story, we take an evidence-based approach, so we have assembled some of the latest available research about the Asian American community in New Jersey and nationwide to present public policy recommendations to advance the causes of the Asian American community. The report also includes the findings of our own original survey, to give readers a sense of how Asian Pacific Americans are living their lives in New Jersey today.
